### Introduction

# Herbs mainly produced in the Mediterranean region



- Large Variety of flavors and active components
- Wild and cultivated
- Labor Intensive & Difficult to process/clean.

### **2015**:

- Global Herbs market was stable in 2015 with overall offer meeting demand except for some few species and origins.
- Effect of climate change :
  - 2015 was the warmest year of all time (Nov.1854).
  - Lower rainfall at the west of Mediterranean area.
  - Negative impact on wild crops.
  - Improvement of biomass of cultivated herbs.

## **2016:**

- Oil price is maintained at its lowest level.
- Severe DROUGHT in the Western Mediterranean countries: EL NINO effect.
  - NO RAINS SINCE NOVEMBER 2015!

#### **2016:**

Renewed interest for cultivated herbs after the fall of prices of major food commodities.

- Increase in costs due to intensification of food safety measures.
- Effect of Foreign Currency exchange and Volatility
- Recurrent Quality problems :
  - Allergens.
  - Adulteration.
  - Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbons PAH
  - PA Pyrrolizidinalkoids (toxid plants)
  - Plastic contaminants.
  - Pesticides residues.

### Basil:

#### Ocimum basilicum

- 100% Cultivated & Main production Country: Egypt
- First cutting to start in June
- There is limited carry over of good quality
- Prices are firm, but stable.
- Quality issues mainly on plastic and flavor



### Basil:

#### Ocimum basilicum

- Morocco: New entry
- First cutting to start in April
- Why/Differentiation?




- Reducing / Splitting Procurement risk (Political and Food Defense // Middle East)
- Earlier Harvest
- Offering a better Quality: Taste, Color, VO, cleanness (Plastic)
- Sustainability









## Laurel Leaves:

#### Laurus nobilis

- Production is concentrated in Turkey.
- It's a wild production. Harvest by September/October
- Sun dried and Oven Dried
- Good weather conditions up to date & Stability of market in short term.
- Carry Over: 20 to 25%, but very small on good quality.
- Demand weaker since December 2015 on normal quality but <u>high on good</u> one.

#### We expect stability or ease of prices in 2016 ->



## Marjoram :

#### Origanum majorana

- 100% cultivated
- Main production country: Egypt
- First cutting in March
- Prices have lowered in Q4/2015.
- Farmers have reduced plantation (as plantation in Q4)
  - Smaller crop size expected in 2016


Firmer Prices ex.2016



Oregano:

Origanum onites & Origanum vulgare

- Production mainly concentrated in : Turkey, Mexico, Peru, Chile and Morocco
- Pressure on High quality Oregano and adulteration



Oregano:

#### Origanum onites & Origanum vulgare

Turkey:


- Wild and Cultivated
- Prices will depend on ratios of Cultivated vs Wild oregano.
- Stability of market in short term.
- Next harvest shall begin from July.
- 15% to 20% Carry Over.







#### Origanum onites & Origanum vulgare




 Good weather conditions and planting areas: Expect 10% increase in 2016 Crop.
Same effect on price ->>>

## Rosemary:

Rosmarinus officinalis

- Production: 95% Morocco, 5% other Mediterranean countries
- 100% wild Crop in Morocco
- Production Price driven by Governmental Collection permit costs and weather conditions.
- Rosemary marketing segments (Total 11.000MT):



### Rosemary:

Rosmarinus officinalis


- 2015 prices were +30% vs. 2014 (lack of collection permits but good weather conditions)
- 2016: Sever drought with no rains since 11/2015 but More collection permits scheduled in 2016.
- Carry over : about 10% in Jan 2016.
- High Demand on Essential Oils and Anti Oxidant (+5%/yr)


- Stable demand on Culinary

#### Rosmarinus officinalis





Thyme:

Thymus vulgaris & satureioides

Polish Thyme: (Thymus vulgaris)


- 100% Cultivated
- Crop failure in 2015.
- Farmers holding back Material to get High Prices
- Too early to give clear Forecast but price should drop

Morocco:(Thymus satureioides)

- 100% Wild.
- 2015 was a fair crop but still below normal
- 2016: Sever drought with no rains since 11/2015
- Prices already up. If no rains in Feb./Early March, crop will be definitely short.
- Prices should be higher in 2016


#### Salvia officinalis


- Both wild and cultivated
- Production country: Albania(80%) & Turkey (20%)
- Good production in 2015.
- Cultivated sage becomes important in Albanian production.
- ▶ 30-35% carry over
- Ease of price



Disadvantages of Cultivated Sage in Albania compared to Wild Sage.

- Excessive pesticide usage.
- Usage of fertilizers causing thicker stem and weaker leaves.
- Lower volatile oil content; hence weak flavor.





## Turkish Sage

#### Salvia triloba

- This crop is only wild.
- This type of sage is different than officinalis both physically and flavor wise.
- Every year there is limited quantity coming from the forests due to lack of manpower to collect this item.
- There is excessive amounts of adulteration in Turkish Sage with mainly White Cistus and Olive Leaves(60% adulterated).
  - Good weather condition.

## Spearmint:

### Mentha spicata

Harvesting starts on May, 4 times/year-All year round

Relatively high prices of last season and small carry over caused the market to open at the same price levels of last season, however good crop size immediately pulled down the prices.

#### Stable market expected in 2016
